



JUNIOR SCHOOL

All Pupils Study

English, Mathematics, Science, Music, Design & Technology, ICT, History, Geography, Art, Religious Education, PSE, Reading Skills, Physical Education, Games and Drama.

Pupils in Years 5 and 6 take an introductory course in Modern Languages.

SENIOR SCHOOL

Year 7

All pupils study English, Mathematics, Science, Modern Languages (two from French, Spanish and German), Latin, History, Geography, Design Technology, Art, Music, ICT, Religious Education, Physical Education, Swimming, Games and PSE.

Year 8

As Year 7, other than Science, which is taught as three separate subjects (Biology, Chemistry and Physics) and swimming, which is not timetabled.

Year 9

As Year 8. Pupils study Latin and one Modern Language or the two Modern Languages studied in Years 7 and 8.

Years 10 & 11

All pupils study to GCSE: English Language, English Literature, Mathematics and two or three of Biology, Chemistry and Physics (as Single Sciences).

There is also an afternoon of Games, one PE lesson and one lesson of PSE in each 6-day cycle.

Pupils will also study 4 or 5 of the following subjects:

History	Latin	Spanish	Electronic Products
Geography	French	Art	Graphic Products
Business Studies	German	Music	Resistant Materials
Religious Studies	Drama	PE	ICT

The middle school curriculum is designed to prevent early specialisation in Arts or Sciences, keep options open for A level, and provide some choice to cater for individual strengths and interests whilst, at the same time ensuring a broadly-based education for each pupil.

SIXTH FORM

Year 12

All students choose 4 AS level subjects (5 if one is Further Mathematics) from:

English Literature, Economics, Business Studies, History, Geography, Politics, French, German, Spanish, Latin, Art, Technology, Music, Mathematics, Further Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, ICT, PE, Psychology, Religious Studies, Theatre Studies, Drama, Design & Technology (Product Design).

Availability of some courses may depend upon demand.

A weekly Lecture is given on a variety of topics by speakers from within and outside the school. A PSE Programme is also included.

Games: One afternoon in each 6-day cycle is given to Games. A wide range of activities is available.

Year 13

Students will usually continue with 3 of their Subjects to A level. All students will take AS level General Studies in January and most students also take A level General Studies in June.
