In Phonics we have been playing lots of listening games and learning how to recognise sounds at the beginning of words.

We have also been finding out about different celebrations, we talked about the Hindu festival of **Diwali** and how it is celebrated.

The children listened to the story of Rama and Sita and made their own Rangoli patterns using shapes and colours.

We then finished off this term with our topic **'Christmas'** we discussed why it

In History, the children have learnt about popular toys through the 20th and
